The Festival Fringe



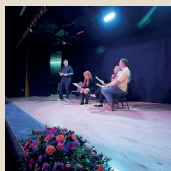

weekend exhibition by the newly-formed Carraig Creatives at Wilson's Mall.

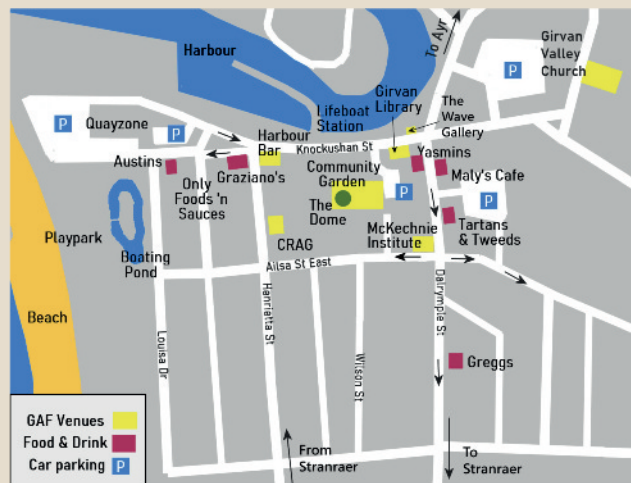

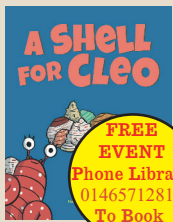

A unique gypsy jazz quartet made up from four of Ayrshire's top musicians. They play originals and gypsy favourites and have a unique flavour to their sound.

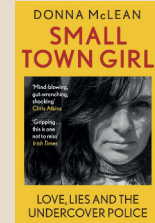

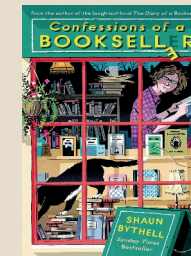
John McKenna: Mastering Sculptural Excellence

From intricate cast bronzes to colossal stainless steel structures, John McKenna works with a diverse range of media and subjects and is one of the most respected sculptors in Scotland.



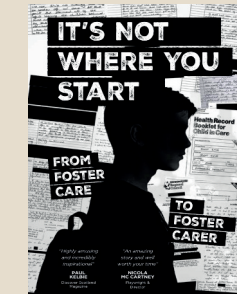
12:30-1:30 Community Garden £5 Donna McLean: Small Town Girl
